



Hospital Managers' Development Programme

Hospitals form the backbone of the public health system since this is where the bulk of public health service delivery occurs. The management of such facilities requires a unique skills set and the ability to plan, implement and account for the operations of key national assets. A cohort of professionals should be groomed to contribute to the delivery of high-yielding health solutions to communities.

Structure

This programme will be delivered over 5 days. Delegates will be required to complete a project in order to successfully complete the programme. Delegates completing the programme will be awarded with a certificate of competence.

Who should attend?

- Public health officials
- Medical professionals belonging to public health facilities
- Officials responsible for oversight functions in the public health area
- Those responsible for administering critical public health-related decisions on a day-to-day basis in large medical facilities

Upon completion of the programme, delegates should be able to:

- Manage and govern public medical facilities of different sizes, including mental health facilities and similarly unique institutions in terms of operational, tactical and strategic level functioning.
- Plan, implement and account for public health facilities' operations.
- Attend to financial, human resources and procurement-related responsibilities.
